Marines, below is information received from the BLTS program manager at the end of September 2025.

- 1. Ever since Mr. Madison retired from DLI, Mr. Luke Mitchell (831-242-5404; luke.mitchell@dliflc.edu) currently serves as Non-Resident Scheduling Administrator who is in charge of BLTS courses as well as other non-resident courses. Even though he is not part of the LREC PP, which the BLTS team belongs to, we are closely working together on a daily basis and we have always been in active contact with each other. Therefore, all the BLTS request forms that are filled out should be sent to him for further processing.
- 2. As for instructor availabilities, we are able to support the following languages (Russian, Chinese Mandarin, Korean, Persian Farsi, French, Spanish, and Modern Standard Arabic) in-house and potentially other languages (such as Turkish or German) by reaching out to other schools (depending on the instructor availabilities of those schools at a given moment). We currently do not have available resources for Japanese and Indonesian.
- 3. The instructor availabilities are mainly determined based on their traveling assignments at a given moment. Historically, we used to have no problems supporting in-house language BLTS courses. But recently, due to the sharp increase of traveling duties of the Chinese, Korean, French, and Spanish instructors especially Chinese & Korean we unfortunately have had to turn down many of the BLTS requests. While we let our students know when the next availabilities are, many instructors received ad-hoc traveling assignments meanwhile. Recently, the students have not encountered much problem getting Modern Standard Arabic, Russian or Persian Farsi teachers for their BLTS requests.
